Demonstrative adjectives point out specific nouns. They function as adjectives when they are with a noun, and as pronouns when they are alone.

Example:

Sparky does not like **that** dog food, but he likes **these** chew toys.

There are only four demonstrative adjectives: *this*, *that*, *these* and *those*. Use *this* and *that* when referring to singular nouns, and *these* and *those* when referring to plurals. They may also be used to tell how near something is.

Can you see **this** card I'm holding? How about **that** one, on the floor?
